CGCC is excited to announce *Disabled Legacies, Crip Futures: Disability in Art, History, and Dreaming*, an exhibit showcasing disability history and student art that embodies lived experience with disability.

Students with disabilities* are invited to submit up to three completed and fully original works of two-dimensional art (such as paintings, digital art, collage, drawings, or photography) or a short piece of writing (up to one single-sided page) including poetry and prose. No AI-generated art or writing will be accepted. Submitted works must pertain to the student's lived experience with disability and/or the student's imaginings of a future that centers disability and disability justice.

What do you think of when you dream of a future where your disability needs are met?

The submission form includes a section where students can speak to their inspirations and the significance or meaning of their work. If selected, students may be asked to give a brief, 5-10-minute talk about their piece at the opening ceremony. Students are encouraged to invite family, friends, and other loved ones to attend the opening ceremony. Refreshments provided.

*Please note: No one will ask you any questions about whether you are or aren't disabled, what your disabilities are, or try to determine if you are "disabled enough." If you identify with being disabled, your contributions are welcome here!
