All students will design projects that synthesize drawing skill and self expression/personal ideas through multiple ideation strategies such as thumbnail sketches, experimentation with composition, and image research following the artistic integrity guidelines of the class. .

* Outcome #2: Method to assess student understanding

Assessment through verbal participation based on guidelines for critique which include active participation, use of unit vocabulary, analysis of one's own work, and respectful analysis of the work of others.

* Outcome #3: Method to assess student understanding

Students will complete a final symbolic still life project including objects of personal meaning to the student to include transparent, reflective, and opaque objects. The drawing will synthesize all perceptual/observational drawing skills including contour, negative space, proportion, value and perspective.

* 4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? Outcome #1:

1-5 scoring guide with criteria for each project met which includes project includes specific criteria for generating ideas following artistic integrity. expressive components, and verbal and/or written reflection. 100% of students will earn a 3 or higher on finished projects based on these criteria.

All students will actively participate in weekly critiques for which they are present using unit vocabulary to respectfully describe and analyze their own work and the work of others in the class.

* Outcome #3: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

All students will earn a 3 or higher on the 1-5 scale on Final Still Life drawing which will synthesize all observational drawing skills including contour, negative space, proportion, value and perspective and will include symbolic objects with personal meaning to the student. Written self evaluation and critique will be used to describe personal meaning.
